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


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

PHOTO QUALITY

We at the club office, love to run photos of members' cars. The problem is we do not get enough of them sent and when we do they are not high quality.

Remember what may look good on your computer screen may look terrible in print. Why? Because a computer monitor only requires 72 pixels per inch to show a high quality photo. To achieve the same look for the magazine, the photo must be 300 pixels per inch. This means start out using the camera with a setting of 3 megapixels or more.

Also choose a background that accentuates the vehicle. Do not use colors that clash with the paint. Remember vertical photos work better for front and back magazine covers.

Try to shoot the photo early in the morning or late in the day when the sun is low. Generally keep the sun at your back and shoot the lit side of the vehicle. Keep your shadow out of the photo. Shoot engines in the shade to avoid unwanted sunspots and shadows. Shoot interiors in the shade from the driver's side with the hood closed.

Photos that will be considered for the cover should be shot in portrait (vertical) mode rather than landscape (horizontal) mode.

Now write a story that includes why you wanted the car, how and where you found it, why you love it or anything else you think readers would find interesting. Then email it to us or save onto a CD or USB drive and mail it to us. Then sit back and watch for it to appear in the club magazine!



'BIRDS IN FLIGHT

Editor's Note: this is the eighth in a series of columns about interesting stories connected with Firebirds and Trans Ams.

In my last column, we reviewed prices of Firebirds and Trans Ams at auctions held early in the year. The two auctions we featured – Mecum's extremely large Kissimmee (Fla.) auction and Barrett-Jackson's in Scottsdale (Ariz.) – are both held in January at opposite ends of the country. Those are followed by more B-J and Mecum auctions in Las Vegas, Glendale (Ariz.), Palm Beach and Amelia Island (Fla.), and Indianapolis (Mecum's second largest). The summer brings on an auction in Monterey, plus the MAG auction at Hot August Nights in Reno.

If you want to track the value of your 'Bird, auctions are a reliable source. Websites like ClassicCars.com and Hemmings, the Bible for classic car collectors, will give you asking prices; auctions will give you "sold" prices. What is my car worth today? Head to an auction site or check prices after the auction ends. Of note: Hemmings has also gone into the auction business, holding them online.

January sets the stage

We saw some competitive prices for F-bodies at the Mecum and Barrett-Jackson auctions in January, including a 1973 Firebird Formula (400 ci, 4-speed) for \$66,000 (Ed. note: I had one of these in the mid-1990s in Navajo Orange and rare ram air induction. I sold it for about \$3,500.) A 1979 Trans Am 10th Anniversary car with the coveted 400 ci and 4-speed sold for \$62,700.

And, of course, the penultimate: a 1979 Pontiac Trans Am, unrestored with 38 miles (maybe the ride home from the dealership?), sold for \$118,250.

In my last column, we also highlighted a second, low-mileage 1979 Trans Am going up on the block at Mecum's Glendale, Arizona auction on March 18. I was up front and close to this car, and watched it go through bidding on the Mecum stage. This car, a SE Black and Gold edition, had 145 miles and the desirable 400 ci, four speed combination.

The price? The bidding started at \$50,000 and went up quickly, eventually settling at \$145,000.

Checking in at mid-year

Did we see any similar prices for F-Birds during the remainder of the year? Here are some prices for cars sold at Mecum's Indianapolis auction in May.

This auction had \$126.5 million in total overall sales—an 18% increase over the past Indy auction record of \$107 million achieved at last year's event.

The message from collectors and auction houses is that prices are doing well for Pontiacs, particularly the low-mileage copies. Keep those T/As in good condition!

EAST BOUND AND DOWN: SMOKEY AND THE BANDIT HITS 45TH ANNIVERSARY

It is hard to believe that 45 years have passed since Burt Reynolds, Jerry Reed, Sally Field and Jackie Gleason banded together to give us "Smokey and the Bandit." When it was released in 1977 (I was 18 years old), no one expected it to do much in the box office. But it grossed \$126.7 million, right behind Star Wars that year.

The characters in Smokey and the Bandit II proved successful as well, but the third reprisal was not. Reynolds and






Field sat out while Jerry Reed became the new Bandit.

Reynolds had a knack for cashing in on props used in his previous movies (like selling the canoe used in the

movie "Deliverance," in which he starred). He took advantage of the Smokey and Bandit movie's success by selling off Trans Ams he received through the movie and promoted Black and Gold Trans Ams built by Trans Am Depot. The company, which uses Camaros as a base for their modern Trans Am editions, sold 77 Bandit cars to match the year the movie was released. Reynolds appeared in advertisements for the car and signed the glove boxes of each model produced.

The characters in Smokey and the Bandit have been in their last high-speed pursuit; Gleason, who played Texas sheriff Buford T. Justice, died in 1987 of colon and liver cancer. Reed died in 2008 at age 71 due to complications from emphysema and the "Bandit" Burt Reynolds died in 2018 of a heart attack at the age of 82. Sally Field is now 75 years old.

The re-release of the movie in May and June at select theaters across the country coincided with the dates this year for the Bandit Run, a tour put on for Trans Am owners and their cars by Restore a Muscle Car.



This year the Bandit Run's route followed that from the movie – Texarkana, Arkansas to Helen, Georgia. Over 160 Trans Am participated in the run. The event included behind-the-scenes photos from the filming of Smokey and the Bandit and stories from people who watched it being filmed and from actors who were in the movie.

After leaving Texarkana, the group drove to Vicksburg, MS and then to Destin, FL.

From Destin the group traveled to Helen, GA, where much of the filming of the movie took place. Stops included the 'Kissing Bridge' where Burt Reynolds and Sally Field had some romantic moments.

Some of the key lyrics from the movie's theme song, written and sung by Jerry Reed:

East bound and down, loaded up and truckin',

We're gonna do what they say can't be done.

We've got a long way to go and a short time to get there.

I'm east bound, just watch ol' "Bandit" run.

We certainly did.

Q: What would you pick, 3.23 or 3.42 rear axle ratio? 345hp/420tq 403 olds TH350 stock converter, currently has 2.41 axle. Occasional highway round trips of 60 miles, other than that usu-

ally cruising in town. We live out of town so always have a 4-mile highway drive to get into town. I was leaning towards the 3.42's but now having some second thoughts on it being too steep. No interstate driving..

A: Without an overdrive, I'd personally prefer a 3.23 or 2.93 and a slightly loose torque converter (something that stalls near but under 3000 rpm). The thing with an automatic is you can compensate for a taller final drive by

running a higher stall and still get the same torque multiplication as a shorter final drive but retain sane highway RPMs, especially if you're running a lockup torque converter. A 3.42 or 3.73 would be best if you were running a 200-4R or a manual transmission.

Frank Gore

Q: I need a recommendation to replace the power antenna for my 1989 Turbo Trans Am. Any suggestions on a suitable replacement? GM Classic doesn't have any suggestions. Problem: original is 16 inches plus mast. I need close to same to avoid fender well issues. Thanks in advance.

Alan Darr

A: If the motor still works and it's just the cable that's bad, they can be rebuilt.

I know thirdgen.org has a long thread about them.

Q: Just wondering if anyone else out there has a 4th gen Firebird or Trans Am that came from the factory with the engine compartment clear coated. My 1996 Ram Air Trans Am delivered to me on December 22, 1995 had the engine compartment clear coated at the factory and I have never seen another one since.

A: It's considered rare. I have seen several over the years, especially at the Trans Am Nationals but they are few and far between.

Q: I am once again looking for some help. I am replacing the bulbs in the tail tights and brake lights because they have never been changed and they were getting dim. I believe the driver side is correct and the passenger is wrong

Can someone confirm that this is correct?

In the picture, the 2 farthest right lights on the passenger side should be flipped so don't mind that.

As you can see, with the lights on, the one next to the reverse light stays bright all the time. I'm not sure if it's the bulb or the wiring of the socket? Any help is greatly appreciated!

A: Left to right it should be: 1156, 1157, 1157, 1156. Try flipping the bright one...you CAN install these backwards it seems.

A lot of times when you get that issue one of the bulbs has a filament that is grounding out. Before you go nuts, with the lights on pull each bulb individually to see the others change at all. But I'd definitely start with new bulbs and go from there. Cheap and easy.

Q: The best remedy for cleaning the tail light lenses? Also thinking about bright LED reverse lights.

Kaeden Dré Stewart

A: Inside the lights or outside? If outside find a detailer in your area to clean and polish the lenses. If inside remove the globes and use an air blower off your air compressor and blow them out.

Paul Reichelt

Q: I have a 93 TA. When my lights are off, my right rear turn signal works properly. When my lights are on, one bulb goes off and the other blinks. Help?

Jill Anthony

A: Many grounds are located on the front fenders and radiator core support. Ideally, I would look at wiring diagrams and locations.

Jeff Goodwin

Q: Anyone ever use Dupli-Color Vinyl & Fabric dye? Thinking about trying it and seeing the best way to go about it.

Kaeden Dré Stewart

A: I used it on a set of t top shades I found in a junk yard and got for \$10. Lightly misted the carpet and used a few light coats working it in with a soft brush. They turned out fine but they are not as soft since the fabric has paint in it. Not sure I would dye carpet with it. Definitely try a very small area or scrap piece first.
