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

Ibought my '68 burgundy Firebird convertible in 1982. The engine ran, but the car wouldn't go. It was a Flintstone car with massive holes in the driver and passenger foot wells. The sheet metal was not dented or rusted with the exception of the hood and the trunk lid. The top, of course, was in tatters. I bought the car for \$350. I think the original AM/FM radio is worth more than that on eBay today.

I towed the car home and found that the reason the car didn't move was because the transmission repair shop that 'fixed' the ST300 2-speed transmission had only replaced one of the 3 bolts that connect the torque converter to the transmission flex plate. The remaining bolt sheared off hence the failure of the car to proceed. I bought many replacement parts (GM fenders, new top, etc., mostly from the Paddock in Indiana.)

A professional welder friend of mine welded in new floor pans. I paid for a really cheap paint job from a guy who was in school learning how to paint. Along came a marriage, two kids, family vacations, college expenses and the Firebird waited patiently in the corner of the garage to be restored properly. I am nearing retirement and am interested in seeing the car restored to its former self.




'74 TRANS AM OF PERRY PEGORARO








'78 FORMULA OF DAVID MINATO

Editor's Note: this is the seventh in a series of columns about interesting stories connected with Firebirds and Trans Ams.

Most of you who read this column bought your Firebird or Trans Am to drive and enjoy. We're not big fans of trailer queens. These pony cars were known for their good looks and great handling and beg for a twisty road. So, we oblige.

Nonetheless, we also like to know how the value of our cars are holding up in the classic car market. We all have heard the saying that "once you drive your (new) car off the dealership lot, it starts losing money." There are exceptions, of course, and that's what this month's column is about. With the stock market showing a lot of volatility lately, more people are investing in vintage sheet metal.

So I thought I would look at sales from car auctions on how our Firebirds and Trans Ams have fared since the start of the new year. Of course, there are other ways to track car value, such as going on websites like eBay, Bring A Trailer, ClassicCars.com, Hemmings, etc. But auction sales have some advantages.

- 1. You can see and touch the car, look under the hood, start it up
- 2. You can find out after the auction takes place what the car sold for
- 3. You usually get a good rundown of the car's features and accessories

Certainly, there are challenges to BUYING a car at auction, but that's material for another column.

GOOD PRICING SO FAR

The year always starts with the country's two largest auctions: Mecum's 10-day, 1,500+ vehicle auction in Kissimmee, Florida, and the Barrett-Jackson Classic Car Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona. In my home state, in fact, Barrett was one of four classic car auctions that took place in January, all during the week.

Of course, celebrity status can increase the price quickly, as the '77 Trans Am from the Bandit demonstrated (the car was only a show vehicle, and not used in the movie).





But ultimately, low mileage is a major price mover. Here is one that went on sale at Mecum's auction in Glendale, Arizona on March 18. We'll share the final price in our next 'Birds of Flight column, but here are the details:

1979 Trans Am

110 miles, 400 ci, 4 spd.

We'll see!

Mecum says "this exquisite example must rank as one of the lowest-mileage and most original of the 1,107 units produced" in 1979.

"Finished in its factory-applied Starlight Black with a Camel Tan Custom interior, this particular Y84 Trans Am SE came with the 400 T/A 6.6 V-8 and floor-shifted, close-ratio 4-speed, as well as power steering and power 4-wheel disc brakes, a tilt steering column, AM/FM stereo with dual rear speakers, power windows and door locks, Special Performance Package and a limited-slip differential."

And there are more auctions to come in 2022.





This issue's featured car is the '88 Trans Am GTA of Dave and Jodi Przybysz of Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania. Here is their story:

My wife, Jodi, and I have wanted our own collector car for years. Financially, it just never seemed to be the right time so we lived vicariously through my father, going to shows and car cruises in one of his classic or antique cars that he had restored.

Then one day, in the middle of a substantial home remodeling project, our contractor told us about this 1988

Pontiac Firebird Trans Am GTA.

He said it's been in his buddy's garage for years and he believed he would sell the car. We thought..."Wow! A true barn find!" Not really being in the position to purchase, we made arrangements to go see the car anyways.

It was gorgeous and with only 12k miles on the odometer, it was something we knew we just couldn't pass up! The car was stored for 17 years, in a clean climate controlled garage (not really a barn find). It was sitting sideways in the back of the garage on wheel dollies. The owner just simply stopped driving it one day and began driving a different vehicle in their collection and so there it sat.

The stickers on the windshield indicated that the last time the car went through a Pennsylvania state inspection was 2003! A price was negotiated and arrangements were made to have a flat bed pick it up. We bought it without even knowing if it would run!

Thanks to our good friend, who is also a mechanic, all the proper maintenance and repairs were preformed to get



her running again! We flushed the fuel and brake systems, replaced the fuel pump and injectors and all four tires were replaced. The air conditioning compressor was bad so we replaced it and upgraded the refrigerant. Finally we rebuilt the power antenna motor and then we fired her up. After 17 years she roared back to life!

The history of the car is kind of interesting. As I understand it, the car was purchased new in the Philadelphia area. At some point the car was stolen. It was eventually recovered although, I do not know in what time frame that this occurred. The GTA had sadly been partially disassembled. The radio and taillights were missing, there was a scratch down the passenger side, the windshield was missing

and the VIN tag had been removed.

The second owner had purchased the car at an insurance auction.

Oddly enough, because the major components of the car were still intact, the car retains a clean title with a reissued VIN. The taillights and radio were replaced, as were the windshield and the paint was repaired.

Today she sits in our garage. It goes out on nice days to car cruises or for drives in the country, sometimes just to go get ice cream and occasionally to work. Since We've owned it, it's never even seen the rain.

Now, she's not perfect. There are small



details and imperfections that we will enjoy detailing as time goes by but, she is better than anything we ever dreamed that we would own!

Recent events in our lives have proved to us that there is never a right time and that life is too short. The timing, financially, was definitely not right for us to purchase this car but, it is a dream come true and a continuation of a family tradition...In fact...our Trans Am bares the Pennsylvania Antique license plate that was originally registered to my fa-



TECHNICAL SECTION - QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: I need advice. I've got a 1988 Firebird 2.8 liter V6. Just got it last month. So it drove away from the owner, and was kind of hesitant. Then one day, it just wouldn't start. It gave me codes to replace a few things, and I did. I have installed new plus, wires, distributor cap and rotor. (I did not mess with the actual distributor, so I didn't change the timing).

I changed the throttle position sensor, the battery and the air filter. I did an oil change, and a transmission filter and fluid change. I changed the O2 sensor, installed a brand new fuel tank (rust inside), fuel pump, fuel pump relay, and fuel filter.

It keeps throwing code 54, which is fuel pump circuit, low voltage. The car cranks, starts, then almost immediately stops,. I'm at a loss here people. I have changed the fuel tank sending unit, filter and relay. What am I missing? Any help or advice is appreciated!

A: Rust particles from the fuel tank will get past the filter and build up in the fuel injectors and restrict the flow. Pull the fuel rail off the injectors and look inside the injectors. That was a problem I ran across. My tank was rusted also and had to replace it.


Q: The speakers in my 1983 Firebird are blown. I am looking to replace them. Any recommendations on type and brand to go with?

Ashley Nicole Green

A: I just put the Kicker KS Series 2 way car speakers in the backseat with their $4 \ge 6$ twin in the front. I hooked

them all up to the Kicker Key 200.4 mini amp and stuck that under the passenger seat. Sounds phenomenal! They can take way more power than the Key 200.4 amp puts out. In my opinion I would get a much more powerful amp than the Kicker Key 200.4. You won't be disappointed.

The 6 x 9 comes with their own crossovers (plug 'n play) that you must use, otherwise the tweeter won't work and all you'll get is bass output. Brian Daniel



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS (CONTINUED)

Q: This is my 1978 Firebird TA and I am restoring it. I'm getting to the point of actually putting it back together. These pictures are from when I started taking it apart). For the paint I've had several people tell me to strip the whole car and start with fresh primer. Others have told me to use the paint already on it as a primer since I am planning to keep it black.

There is a lot of rust and people have told me to only take paint off of the rust and clear surface rust and repair anything rusted all the way through then fresh primer that area. I am at a loss of what to do and really need opinions or even stories or anything you have done when painting a car.

A: Take her down to the bare metal. You should be able to do this in sections so you will not have too much of the car exposed to the elements.

Make a note of all areas of cancer, bad body work etc. This will give you an idea of how much sheet metal will have to be replaced and you'll be able to see the areas where you need to do your body work.

You can treat the bare steel with Ospho rust remover, a chemical that will kill the rest of the rust that you can't remove and give you a temporary protective coating on bare steel. This chemical is a phosphoric acid and modern primers do not stick to it so you're going to have to really clean the surface really good with mineral spirits before you shoot it with an epoxy primer which is a sealer because it's non-porous.

If you don't have a way to shoot with a paint gun, Eastwood products makes an epoxy primer that you can apply with a foam roller.

Most if not all epoxy primers will give a time frame in which you can top code it maybe around 7 days or so. Anytime you go beyond this 7 day window all you have to do is apply a reduced coat of epoxy primer after scuffing the existing primer that has been applied with Scotch Brite and it will reactivate it and you will have a new window in order to top coat it. You cannot apply modern paint and finishes on top of the lacquer base paint so you're going to have to remove all the old paint.

Q: I am looking to replace my front struts for a 2001 V6 Firebird. What you all recommend? Thanks in advance.

A: Good aftermarket parts house stuff is fine for the V6 cars. They do not really beat on the front end as much as the V8 cars do. I have been told they actually are better balanced, Todd Redwine

Q: I am looking at possibly purchasing an '87 GTA that needs engine rebuild. I would prefer it to have WS6 Handling package. I have read good things about rear-disc brakes. Are rear disc brakes a sign that it is so equipped? If not, are there any clues without having a VIN? Thanks for your information!

A: Not all GTA's have rear disc brakes. I have seen an '87 GTA L98 cars with rear drums, and my '91 L98 GTA had drums when I got it. It was a delete option of some sort where you could downgrade to drums and save some cash

Q: I need help redoing a 1981 Trans Am and cannot find current paint codes for the gray dash, center console and front kick panels and the silver for the rear sail panels, front pillar post and headliner trim. I can find a code for the silver (102g) but paint stores cannot find a current code. George Powell

A: Try Ames Performance at the interior paint section. Also The Parts Place in Dekalb, Illinois.

Firebird Central has all interior colors. They are aerosols made by SEM. I just touched up my '80 TA's interior last winter.
